Governor's Comments

Included in this newsletter is the latest status report for trip raffle ticket sales. This is probably the most important district fund-raiser in many years. As most of you know, The Rotary Foundation has severely restricted their funds available for matching grants. This situation may continue in the future.

Districts are being advised to use their DDF monies in place of Foundation grants. Our DDF is based on 50-percent of contributions three years ago (2007-06). Currently, club requests for DDF and District Simplified Grants have far exceeded our monies available.

A successful trip raffle fund-raiser, with the proceeds being offered as a match to individual contributions, has the potential to elevate our Foundation support to a record level. This will not provide any more dollars for grants in 2009-10, but three

years from now there would be a substantial increase in funds available. The raffle is an investment in the future.

Each club president was given two tickets per member. We expect a large number of sales to non-Rotarians. Some Rotarians who have retail businesses have set up displays using the promotional rack

also given to the club presidents and are also selling tickets in their establishments. Many clubs are offering tickets as an incentive for bringing in a new member or in their weekly 50/50 drawing. Sales opportunities are limited only by your imagination. Tickets would make ideal Christmas gifts for employees or family members.

The bottom line is that each club in District 6920 - small, medium and large - should support the fund-raiser with the sale of their initial ticket allotment as a minimum effort. Don't let the district down and disappoint Rotarians in 2012-13 who will have important projects to fund.
