Ring the Bell The Salvation Army

Each year, our club volunteers to ring the bell for The Salvation Army for one day during the Christmas season. This year we will be assisting at Wal-Mart on North Perimeter on *Thursday*, *December 9*.

Throughout the year, The Salvation Army is here as a constant source of help for the community. The Salvation Army in Valdosta reaches out to the very heart of need with both Christian compassion and practical action. The Salvation Army and your support positively touch lives by: Assisting 1,058 families through The Salvation Army Family Emergency Assistance Program, 920 individuals received food during the year, 1,265 men, women, and children received clothing, 18 families were prevented from becoming homeless, 178 families were assisted so electricity and/or gas were not turned off, 350 families received a food basket during the month of December, 708 children received Christmas presents including clothes, shoes, toys, books and games, The Salvation Army referred 3,453 cases to collaborative partners for additional assistance, 9 campers experienced a 5-day overnight camp at The Salvation Army Camp Grandview located in the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains in North Georgia.

Volunteers will be asked to ring he bell for one short hour. Once again, **Art Smith** is leading the effort and is currently looking for skilled ringers. If you have never helped at the kettles, you will be surprised at how much you will enjoy your time. Please see Art and sign up today.

TOYS FOR TOTS

For years, Rotarian **Ty O'Steen** has worked with The Marine Corp "Toys for Tots" campaign. They collect and sort donated toys and distribute them to needy kids. Our region covers Lowndes county and six other surrounding counties. However, all toys collected in Lowndes County are distributed *in Lowndes County*. They work with DFACS and with area churches to assist in the screening process.

Last year the campaign assisted 37,351 families of which about 14,000 were from Lowndes County. In the past "Toys for Tots" National Foundation has been able to help by sending truck loads of toys donated by corporations. However, this year the National Foundation has warned that they will not be able to send any toys. *Your help is needed!* If you are interested in helping, please contact Ty O'Steen or bring your unwrapped toys to your next meeting and we will see that it gets in the right hands.

IMAGINATION LIBRARY

The Rotary clubs of Valdosta, Valdosta North, and Valdosta Sunrise are working with the Ferst Foundation and the Dolly Parton Foundation to raise money for books for pre-school children in Lowndes County. Children enrolled in the program receive an Imagination Library book - from The Little Engine that Could to Look Out Kindergarten, Here I Come - each month until age five.

COMMUNITY PARTNERS IN EDUCATION [CPIE] - Our club is partnered with Valdosta's and Lowndes County's only Title I public schools to provide educational Assistance.

PAUSE TO PASS / SCHOOL LIBRARIES

Cups are passed at each table every week. The money raised is donated to the libraries at J.L. Lomax and Pine Grove Elementary Schools, our CPIE schools

MAGAZINES FOR STUDENTS

Magazines are brought to the meeting on the first Wednesday of every month. They are collected as members walk in and taken to J.L. Lomax School for children to read.

READING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

These students compete in a contest in the local clubs, and the top two contestants from each club advance to the Zone competition. The winner from the Zone will present his or her speech at the District Conference and receive a check for \$1,250

Our club helps sponsor a foreign student to attend VSU for one year. A family from our club helps host the student during his or her stay in Valdosta


