Stephenson, a June graduate, served as governor f o r the high school district this vear.

He said the decision to allow female membership was made at the state meeting at Jekyll Island this spring. The membership question was the main issue at the meeting said Stephenson

"There was a lot of discussion about it and several who were really negative on the question changed their minds after hearing all the pros and cons on it," he explained. upon by the clubs. "The Key Club doesn't have girls, and I think this is one reason why some of the boys were hesitant about taking in

the females. I personally look for Interact to have a much stronger year because of this
